- Recent graduates
- Early career professionals, including creative and performing artists/musicians

- U.S. citizen by the application deadline
- Bachelor's degree or equivalent by start of grant
- No doctorate at the time of application
- Country-specific requirements

- Abstract of "Statement of Grant Purpose"
- Host Country Engagement
- Future Plans

2. Essays

- Statement of Grant Purpose
 - Research/Study (6,000 character limit) Mission/feasibility/contribution
 - English Teaching Assistantship (3,000 character limit)
 - country choice/qualification











Application Components

3. Evaluator & References

- Foreign Language Evaluation
 - o "Required" "Recommended"
- Three (3) References
 - Research/Study 3 letters
 - ETA 3 people answering 5 questions

4. Transcripts

Unofficial transcripts accepted



Factors in Selection

- Quality and feasibility of the proposal
- Academic or professional record
- Personal qualifications
- Language preparation
- Advancing the Fulbright Program goals
- Requirements of the program in individual countries
- Experience in host countries

OCTOBER 7, 2025	National Application Deadline, due by 5:00 p.m. ET
NOVEMBER-DECEMBER	U.S. Review: National Screening Committees
JANUARY-MAY	Host Country Review: Fulbright Commissions and/or U.S. Embassy
MARCH-JUNE	Final Selection & Notification: Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board
