- Early career professionals, including creative and performing artists/musicians

- U.S. citizen by the application deadline
- Bachelor's degree or equivalent by start of grant
- No doctorate at the time of application
- Country-specific requirements

Application Components

- 1. Three Short Essays
 - Abstract of "Statement of Grant Purpose"
 - Host Country Engagement
 - Future Plans

2. Essays

- Statement of Grant Purpose
 - Research/Study (2 page) mission/feasibility/contribution
 - English Teaching Assistantship (1 page) country choice/qualification
- Personal Statement (1 page)











Application Components

3. Evaluator & References

- Foreign Language Evaluation
 - "Required" "Recommended"
- Three (3) References
 - Research/Study 3 letters
 - ETA 3 people answering 5 questions

4. Transcripts Unofficial transcripts accepted

5. Other

- Research/Study: Affiliation Letter(s)
- Arts: <u>Supplementary Materials</u>














Factors in Selection

- Quality and feasibility of the proposal
- Academic or professional record
- Personal qualifications
- Language preparation
- Extent to which the candidate and the project will help to advance the Fulbright Program goals
- Requirements of the program in individual countries
- Experience in host countries
